FWAG and the Game & Wildlife Conservation Trust are part of a consortium promoting the Campaign against accidental and illegal poisoning (CAIP). The campaign protects wildlife, livestock and pets by promoting the safe and legal use of pesticides to control pests on farm and within shoots. The project is funded by Defra through the Chemicals Regulation Directorate of HSE.

As part of the campaign a new one day training course to help ensure farmers and gamekeepers' are aware of the correct methods of pest control has been developed. The training covers the use of pesticides, rodenticides, slug pellets, and trapping and how best to protect pets and wildlife.
